Progress Report:

East Lyme's Overlook Park

Photographed on April 17, 2013, at 11:49 am, about an hour after dead low tide, the view above shows the Overlook platform that is nearest the Cini Park entrance to the walkway. Stairs on the far side of this platform lead down to the beach. The 25 foot high black pole on the platform was donated to East Lyme by the East Lyme Public Trust Foundation for the purpose of supporting a 360 ° video surveillance camera that would provide security for the new walkway and beach. An identical video camera pole has been erected on the Overlook platform that is approximately 1,000 feet west of the pole depicted in this photograph.

The tops of both poles rise above the level of the new railroad tracks along Main Street (Route 156). Moving east toward Waterford from The Morton House, one pole is opposite the former Bay View Marine (next to Niantic River Transmission Co.), and the other is opposite the turnoff from Route 156 to Cini Park.

In late April, 114 original engraved boardwalk boards were returned to the new walkway. Each board was inlaid with seven donated inscriptions for a total of 798. They were removed in 2010 for safe keeping before the original boardwalk was demolished. These inscribed boards are now attached under the hand rail on the fence along the walkway. They are displayed in the same numerical order as they were on the original boardwalk and begin at the Cini Park end of the walkway continuing toward Hole In The Wall to the west.
